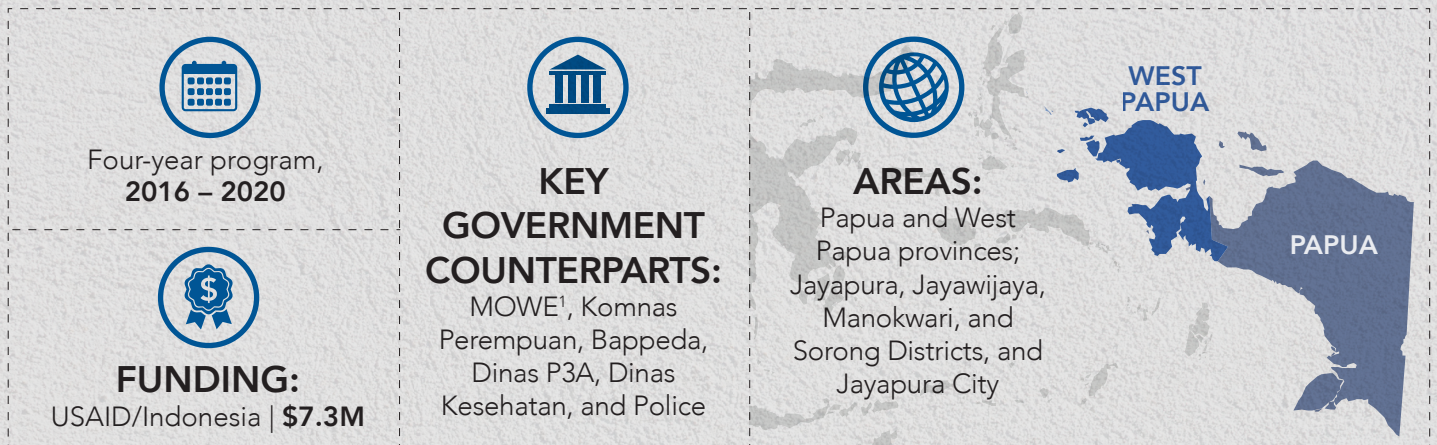

The prevalence of gender based violence (GBV) in eastern Indonesia is high. Thirty-eight percent of women in a relationship with a man experience at least one form of physical and or sexual violence by a male partner in their lifetime.*
