OUR TARGET:

- ★ 10,000 people at risk aware on human trafficking prevention and safe and legal migration process.
- ★ 4,000 potential migrants provided with standardized and comprehensive pre-departure training.
- ★ 1,000 provincial and commune level police officers in target provinces trained on how to combat human trafficking.
- ★ 400 service providers and first responders trained in victim identification and minimum standards of care.
- ★ 1,000 people trained on how to prevent human trafficking using mass media.
- ★ 1,500 survivors supported and reintegrated.

Counter Trafficking in Persons Program (CTIP II)

Counter Trafficking in Person Program in Cambodia (CTIP II) is a USAID funded project to fight human trafficking and labor exploitation in Cambodia. The four years project (2012-2015) is implemented by Winrock International together with government and non- government partners. The project aims to improve the ability and readiness of Cambodian institutions to combat all forms of human trafficking through preventing human trafficking, enhancing the protection and care for trafficked victims and migrant workers and build government capacity to prosecute traffickers and trafficking related crimes.



Human trafficking is growing in Cambodia; the country is involved in transfer, harboring and receiving trafficked persons. Poverty, unemployment, loss of land, and seeking for better lives, are all factors that cause internal and external migration. Men, women and children that migrate in illegal and risky ways, can easily become vulnerable to human trafficking.

Girls and women can be entrapped in domestic slavery in Malaysia and Thailand; men transferred to work on fishing boats, agriculture and construction firms can be forcibly sent to other countries and be enslaved into forced labor. Children from districts bordering Vietnam are often trafficked for begging and forced labor.

Winrock is committed to working with government and non-government partners to combat human trafficking through prevention, protection and other interventions programs at sub national, national and regional levels.

HELPING GOVERNMENT TO END HUMAN TRAFFICKING



Winrock works with Cambodian government to design, lead, coordinate, and evaluate national and regional efforts to combat all forms of human trafficking.

We provide technical assistance to the National Committee on Suppression of Human Trafficking, Smuggling, Labor and Sexual Exploitation to implement national policy on combating human trafficking, smuggling and sexual exploitation.

Our interventions include the implementation and enforcement of policies, the improvement of monitoring mechanism at national and provincial levels and building capacity of selected provincial committees to be able to implement the national policy effectively.



PROTECTING SURVIVORS AND VICTIMS OF TRAFFICKING



Winrock works to enhance survivor protection from all forms of human trafficking and provide them with care services by developing and implementing victim ID channels and guidelines, promoting practical delivery and evaluation of minimum standards for survivor services, and promoting flexible, survivor-driven service delivery and reintegration options.

IMPROVING LAW ENFORCEMENT AND PROSECUTION



Winrock improves law enforcement capacity to identify and prosecute traffickers and human trafficking related crimes by extending standard operating procedures of the anti-human trafficking and juvenile protection department. We support the national police forces to develop consolidated anti-human trafficking training programs for police at national and sub-national level.

PREVENTING MIGRANTS FROM TRAFFICKING AND EXPLOITATION

Winrock promotes effective national and local prevention strategies to reduce human trafficking, including labor trafficking and exploitation by investigating



human trafficking patterns, developing appropriate prevention campaigns for all forms of human trafficking, and establishing centralized locations for pre-decision migrants to obtain information on safe migration or viable economic alternatives.
